## School Trip Payment

Since its introduction to Marr College in December 2017, many parents/carers have used the iPayimpact system successfully to make online payments for school lunches and trips. This is now the payment method required for all our school trips and all parents/carers will be asked to pay this way. We would ask that you do not send cash or cheques to school to pay for deposits or any other instalment of school trips. If you have not already registered for the system, please do so using the unique identifier previously supplied to you in the original letter outlining the system. If you have mislaid this, please contact the school office for a duplicate. When making a payment for a trip, please take care to make the payment against the relevant trip – please do not make this payment in the school meals section if it's for a trip as this will result in a delay in refunding this to you. Should you go to make a payment and you cannot see the trip in question, it may be that it has not yet been set up on the system and will be put on shortly. If you have any difficulties with using the iPayimpact system, please contact the school office.

'Living on one' is a challenge that has been going on at Marr College for a few years. The idea is that everything you consume for 5 days (except water) must be within a daily budget of £1. I decided to take part this year and a friend and I combined budgets so we had £10 for our week's food. After doing our shopping it seemed we had enough food, however as the week went on we began to realise that the type of food we had bought wasn't filling us up or giving us the nutrition we needed. By about the Wednesday

night I was sick of eating plain pasta and dry toast and felt like I had no energy to do anything. I started to think about how for many people it isn't a school challenge, it is a reality and that many people have to go through this week after week without the motivation that it will finish at the school bell on Friday. It would be nearly impossible to experience what living in extreme poverty would really be like. However, 'living on one' gave me a glimpse into the reality of the struggles that many people face on a day to day basis. I was able to see how challenging it must be to never have nutritious food and always be worrying about what you will eat and whether you will have enough. I think it was a very worthwhile
