Parent Council and Community Council Head Teacher Report Wednesday 4th May 2023



On Thursday 16th and Friday 17th March, Marr College was visited by two Education Scotland HM Inspectors to undertake a Thematic Inspection, focusing on our curriculum. Our inspection was positive and below is a summary of feedback shared on Friday afternoon.

- The school is taking into account national guidance and local needs and is outward looking in our approach to shaping a high-quality curriculum. New courses being developed are in response to the needs and interests of young people and reflect local context. We should ensure all staff have an awareness of national guidance to inform curriculum planning.
- Professional learning is used to influence change and we are encouraging teachers to develop a culture of enquiry. Staff are are reflective and seek the views of the school community in designing the curriculum.
- We should try to capture more of 'The Marr Way' and feed this into our curriculum rationale. Highlight within the rationale leadership opportunities for all staff and students
- Identify cross cutting themes, for example digital technology, creativity and sustainability and consider how we are building progression and how subjects are feeding into these themes
- The school is proactive in trying to overcome barriers in relation to delivering the curriculum and partners are enhancing our curriculum offer and are also providing sources of funding to support initiatives.
- There are targeted approaches to reducing the attainment gap, for example the strong model in S1 Literacy and English. We should try to identify other IDL opportunities and ensure that we evidence improvement

Students

- S1-S3 students have been advised about the upcoming Bring Your Own Device pilot, which will provide wifi access for those wishing to bring their device (laptop, netbook, tablet) to school to support their learning. Further information will be shared with parents and carers
- All S1 students will participate in an Interdisciplinary Learning project on plastic waste from 9th 12th May
- The 6-week positive behaviour challenge commences on 15th May and all eligible pupils will have the opportunity to participate in Rewards Day at the end of June
- The timetable change for new S2-S4 students has been brought forward to 15th May and this has been communicated to all parents and carers
- Bronze and Silver Duke of Edinburgh's expeditions are scheduled to take place in May and June

Captains/Prefects:

- S6 Leavers' Hoodies were issued prior to the Easter break
- School Captains delivered a speech to their peer and parents during the recent Leavers' Ceremony
- Applications for School Captain, House Captain and Prefects will be issued to all S5 students towards the end
 of the exam diet

- An S1-S3 Parent Open Evening has been arranged for Monday 15th May. This will provide an opportunity for parents to attend workshops and also feedback on further parent engagement need for the coming session

Staff Update / School Improvement Plan

- Below is an update on current staff appointments and vacancies
 - Mrs E Bolland (current NQT) and Mr W Jackson have been appointed to permanent posts in English
 - Mrs McDonagh has secured a PT English post, commencing 12th June. A vacancy is currently advertised with interviews taking place on 18th May
 - There were no applicants for the post of PT Home Economics to cover Mrs Mitchell's maternity leave. A vacancy has been advertised for a class teacher of Home Economics
 - Interviews for the post of 0.6FTE School Librarian take place on 9th May
 - We have bid for 12 newly qualified teachers for session 2023-24 and will receive confirmation of successful bids on 15th May
- Mr Mark Quirk has now taken up his post as Outdoor Learning Worker to take forward and enhance our successful outdoor programme. Mr Quirk will also support departments to maximise opportunities for outdoor learning within the curriculum
- Mr Harris is leading a 'Smoke Free Schools Initiative' aimed at raising awareness of the dangers of smoking/vaping and ensuring our school is free of smoking/vaping
- Consultation with students, staff, parents and partners on the School Improvement Plan will take place across May and June. The current session Improvement Plan will be reviewed in May and the school Standards and Quality Report will be published at the start of the new session
