Welcome to the Second monthly installment of the Kier Community newsletter.

As you are all well aware, works commenced on site last month with the initial earthworks phase which included the levelling and redistribution of soil around Marr Playing Fields.

Works have progressed well over the last 4 weeks with the successful connection of the underground field drainage followed by the covering of stone aggregate and most noticeably the erection of the permanent fence boundary. The fencing ranges from 3 metres high around the hockey pitch to 5 metres high around the rugby / football pitch and will provide additional security upon completion of the pitches. Another significant milestone was the removal of the old sycamore tree which stood alone in the fields next to the pavilion. This was broken down and donated to the Marr College Technical Woodwork Department and several locals who had registered interest.

Over the next period the site's appearance will change significantly again with the installation of mono-block paving around the pitch boundaries and the construction of a new footpath leading from the pavilion towards the golf course tree line, this will take place during the schools' Easter break to minimise any disruption.

Next month we will give you another update on progress and let you know if there are any items of our works that may affect you. As always, please feel free to contact us if you have any concerns.

Who can I contact to discuss any concerns or complaints that I may have?

How can you help us?

Construction sites are potentially dangerous places to enter especially for non-site personnel. Those who work on the new Marr Pitches site will be required to complete a site induction process. This will explain in detail the potential risks and how they can keep themselves safe at all times. Site personnel are also required to wear special clothing and footwear called Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) to assist in maintaining their safety. Anyone entering the site without PPE or the benefit of the site induction is potentially in great danger. We would ask you to remind your children that they should never attempt to enter the building site. When the site is closed, we would also ask neighbours to report to the police anyone you see on the site that they consider should not be there. Your help and co-operation in this matter is appreciated.
