Welcome to the Third monthly installment of the Kier Community newsletter.

Out of the ten weeks that we have been on site, the last four have been the most significant in terms of noticeable changes. Anyone walking around the site perimeter will be able to observe that we are nearly into the final phase of construction.

The formation of the red monoblock pathways and erection of the 18metre high floodlights provide a much more finished appearance and give a good indication of how the pitches will eventually look upon completion. A public footpath was built during the Easter holidays and this will eventually be used to provide a clear access route from the playing fields pavilion to the golf course tree line where it meets the already existing crossing point.

As seen in the picture above, we recently started installing the 3G synthetic carpet for the rugby pitch, this will be followed by the installation of the hockey pitch carpet and thereafter it will be a matter of final touches, including assembly of dug-out shelters and completing the fence boundary.

Upcoming works that all visitors should be aware of and particularly residents who park their vehicles to the rear of their properties, is the access road works which will take place in the week commencing 25th of May. As part of this project's planning conditions, we are required to widen the access road leading to the playing fields. This means that the surface will be re-tarred and a kerb line installed. However we do not anticipate any major disruption and will ensure that our traffic management plan recognises the need for public access along this road. (Please see a plan of works overleaf).

Next month we will give you another update on progress and let you know if there are any items of our works that may affect you. As always, please feel free to contact us if you have any concerns.

Who can I contact to discuss any concerns or complaints that I may have?

How can you help us?

Construction sites are potentially dangerous places to enter especially for non-site personnel. Those who work on the new Marr Pitches site will be required to complete a site induction process. This will explain in detail the potential risks and how they can keep themselves safe at all times. Site personnel are also required to wear special clothing and footwear called Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) to assist in maintaining their safety. Anyone entering the site without PPE or the benefit of the site induction is potentially in great danger. We would ask you to remind your children that they should never attempt to enter the building site. When the site is closed, we would also ask neighbours to report to the police anyone you see on the site that they consider should not be there. Your help and co-operation in this matter is appreciated.
