

Marr Matters

Dear Parent/Carer,

We have much to be proud of, both in the school and the community due to the efforts of our young people. So as we approach the end of another school year I should like to bring to your attention school related matters and recent events:

- School will close on Friday 29th June at 13.00. For those taking school lunches and or travelling by bus, arrangements have been put in place. The school will reopen for students on Monday 20th August at 8.40am. Should you have to contact school during the holiday period there will be Office staff available to take a message;
- S4-6 students will receive their examination results on Tuesday 7th August. Most have already signed up to get information by email, however, if they need further assistance in this matter then they must contact with Mr McLean before Friday;
- Students who require any changes to their chosen options will be seen by staff when the school term resumes;
- As you know Mr Cameron the Guidance teacher for Fullerton House leaves us at the end of this term. His replacement is Mr. Bell. Mrs Anderson will remain as the Head of House. I am confident that Mr Bell will get to know the young people in his care very quickly;
- You will be aware that the structure of the school day has altered for next session:
Monday and Tuesday – 08.45 – 15.40
(Lunch will be from 13.20 – 14.00)
Wednesday, Thursday and Friday 08.45– 14.50
(Lunch will be from 12.30 – 13.10)
- Each morning from 8.45am – 8.55am there will be Personal Support Time. Students will be in registration groups with a Tutor. This member of staff will meet their group every morning. The changes to the school day and the introduction of Personal support Time is the same in every South Ayrshire secondary school;
- It is important that students arrive at school on time and ready to learn. In addition, one must strive for full attendance;
- The school and community are proud of our purple and gold smart dress traditions and the importance of presentation and behaviour when our young people represent the school daily. Standards of dress have again slipped in a minority of students' cases. I am looking for your cooperation in ensuring that your child adheres to the school uniform. Jeans must not be worn. Full details of the school dress code can be found in the Home Learning Planner;
- Professional training for staff – all schools in South Ayrshire will be closed on Thursday 16th and Friday 17th August to allow this to go ahead.

My tenure as Head Teacher is coming to an end as I retire this term. It has been both an honour and a privilege to be the Head Teacher of Marr College. During this time the school has undergone significant changes; in education, staffing and of course the building of our new facilities.

During this period, attainment has risen with young people achieving their personal goals. This is in part due to the many and varied opportunities provided and also the commitment and dedication of the staff. They have been instrumental in elevating school standards. I am extremely proud that our learners' leave as confident young adults who are skilled and equipped to make the transition into a positive destination of their choice.

In August, Mr George Docherty will be the Acting Head Teacher. I wish him every success in his new post and am certain that he will take Marr forward.


Enterprise
