# Marr Malawi Partnership

S6 Leadership Group

Over the last year, Marr College has established a partnership with a school in the small community of Ntenjera, Malawi. Our partner school has around 2500 pupils, however, they only have 13 classrooms so most lessons are taught under the intense glare of the sun, with trees being the only source of shade. We wanted to help change that.

In order to do this, we decided to arrange a 'Walk to Malawi', where collectively as a school, we would walk the distance from Troon to our partners in Ntenjera, just over 7000 miles away. Our sponsored walk was held on 20<sup>th</sup> September; the full school walked the first 3 miles together before

walking the other 4 miles in our own time, hoping to raise a large sum of money which would be split 50:50 between our partner school and our own. In

Ntenjera, the money would allow the school to buy tables and chairs and with the other half, we hoped to put on an activities afternoon in Marr. In the lead up to the walk, we had lots of contact with our partner school who were all excited about our fundraising

walk; they made videos and took pictures to encourage us. Through this fundraiser, we were hopeful that we would raise £7000 as this is an idea which has proved very successful in other schools. We are currently looking at planning more events throughout this year to raise more money for our partner school. In the future, we are hoping to be able to build classrooms in Ntenjera well as as teacher's accommodation which will help to attract and retain teaching staff.
